A NOTE FROM OUR FOUNDER

Dear Supporter,

As this year draws to a close, it seems the perfect time to reflect on

the progress of our students and graduates, and the impact they are having in remote areas of Nepal. Only a decade ago, there were no doctors in the Karnali Zone (western Nepal) who originated from those districts. Doctors for Nepal has now produced 8 doctors, and we have another 5 who are at various stages of medical school. Our expansion into nursing is ensuring a continuous supply of local nurses who are working in the most remote areas only reachable by walking for days on foot. The impact felt by the community is palpable when we have visited the area - where statistics such as infant and maternal mortality are dramatically falling.

I'm extremely pleased to announce that our recent trustee visit to Nepal has resulted in successful collaboration with the Oda Foundation - a fantastic charity that has set

up a remote Health post in Kalikot district. Two of our DFN nurses - Yuna and Neelam will be joining their team in the new year. Their employment is fully funded by DFN, and we plan to ensure that all of our future scholarships offered receive at least two years of paid employment funded by Doctors for Nepal.

None of this would be possible without your ongoing support. Please do consider either increasing or setting up a standing order if you have not already done so, as this helps us to ensure the stability of the charity and onward planning.



...BUT DFN NEED YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT TO KEEP DOING OUR WORK

There are still not enough doctors, nurses or midwives in the rural areas to serve the population locally. Many patients have to walk for days to receive treatment and often do not receive even basic check ups.

There are students from rural Nepal now who have the academic potential, local knowledge and determination for medical training, but not the financial means. Donating or setting up a standing order with DFN will both help them fulfill their potential and develop healthcare in remote areas.
